
Year 11 Leavers Hoodies Day

Year 9 - Careers Day

As you are aware this Wednesday students in this year group had the opportunity to be out of their usual classes for a day to experience different elements around the theme of careers and post-16 opportunities. They had 2 hours with the Medical Mavericks looking at skills in health and science including drunk goggles, keyhole surgery and taking blood. 1 hour with police learning about the risks of County Lines as well as careers in policing - some students even had an experience in handcuffs! Another hour students accessed Morrisby, our careers platform to consider GCSE options and career aptitude. Their final session was a careers enterprise task which was judged by local professionals. As well as this they had an assembly from the Eastern Education Group outlining post-16 opportunities including apprenticeships, A Levels, College courses and others. This year group will likely have an opportunity for small group sessions with a careers advisor at the end of this year and a one-to-one session in September.
